- Byrdseed Puzzlements for 5-2-2024
 - What happens when <u>popcorn is popped in *super* slow-mo</u>? What tiny details can your students spot? What if you wrote from the popcorn's perspective?
 - An 80-foot steel kraken!? On a WWII warship!? *Sunk to create an artificial reef!*? <u>Here's the video (the sinking starts around 2:30</u>). You can read more about the project here. *Thanks to Jennifer for the link*.
 - How long <u>will that disc spin</u>!? It's called Euler's Disk and, yep, you can find them on Amazon! (Euler is pronounced sorta like "Oiler." He's featured in this <u>Byrdseed.TV math video.</u>)
 - <u>I love this illusion</u>. The dots are traveling in straight lines, yet they appear to spin as a circle. For me, the illusion starts to kick in once there are four dots.
 - I got *really* into Tic-Tac-Toe variants a few years ago. <u>Order and Chaos is top tier</u>. Use a 6-by-6 grid. *Both* players play as Xs *and* Os. One player is Order. They want to get five-in-a-row of either shape. The other player, Chaos, wants to block any five-in-a-rows. <u>Yes, there's video instructions</u> at Byrdseed.TV.
- <u>Beast Academy Playground</u>...K-12 Beast Academy Playground helps kids build numerical literacy and problemsolving confidence with **free** and fun tabletop-hands-on math activities. It has filters for ages 3 through 11+ and most all math concepts. (Click on the filter links to get all the free activities!)
- This August, UW Oshkosh will once again be holding the Summer Oshkosh Mathematics Academy (SOMA), a 4-day summer math camp for students entering grades 6-8. Dates: August 12-15. For more information...
- Facts about Arbor Day: (It was last Friday.)
 - The holiday began with journalist Julius Sterling Morton, who moved from Detroit to Nebraska in 1854. At the time, the wide-open spaces of the west weren't working out so well for pioneers the shadeless prairie was hot in the summer, with few windbreaks to keep tilled soil from blowing right into Kansas. The solution...plant a tree. Morton rose to become the state secretary, and helped establish the first Arbor Day in 1872. More than 1 million trees were planted across the state that first Arbor Day.
 - J. Sterling Morton, who founded Arbor Day, built a family home that looked like the White House. Today the home and its 65 acres are known as Arbor Lodge and is now a state park. It is a 52 room mansion with over 250 different types of shrubs and trees.
 - The National Arbor Foundation estimates that its donations have funded the planting of more than 20 million trees in forests since 1990.
 - Happy Arbor Day! Go hug a tree!
